The Co-op Program wants to get to know you:

You can apply for up to three program streams that you have a serious interest in studying and could interview for multiple streams, but can only accept the offer of a Co-op scholarship in one program.

Part 1 - Online Application

Explain what most attracts you to the UNSW Co-op Program and the academic field(s) you have chosen.

We want to hear about your co-curricular activities (1) and the most important things you gained or learned from these activities (2).

Tell us about your personal development, what you regard as your key strengths and real areas for improvement (3).

Use a situation that highlights your leadership and teamwork (4) then draw on your experiences and talk about your decision making or problem solving (5). Describe a significant achievement or project that showcases your creativity/agility/originality (6). Tell us where you see yourself after graduation (7) and what attributes you have that will make you a successful UNSW Co-op Program scholar (8).

NB: Observe the character limits indicated in the system.

Part 2 - Schools Assessment Page

Nominate your Careers Adviser or Year Level Coordinator to complete your Schools Assessment Page (SAP) within your online application. To give them plenty of time, nominate as soon as you register! SAP submission deadline for schools is early October.

Video Snapshot

If you secure an interview for the Co-op Program you will be sent a link to complete a short 2 minute video to expand on your written application. You must complete your video to be interviewed.

This Program is for students who thrive on challenges, appreciate the opportunities presented to them, make the most of every situation and can commit for the full 4 to 5 year program.

Eligibility

If you meet the following criteria, we strongly encourage you to apply:

- Australian Citizen, Permanent Resident, humanitarian visa holder, or New Zealand Citizen, and
- completing an Australian Year 12 qualification, or equivalent this year, or
- if taking a gap year (up to 2 years), applying in the year before university starts.

Are you a 2026 Co-op scholar?

Academic requirements

To accept a Co-op scholarship in 2026 you must gain entry into the chosen degree program at UNSW and achieve a minimum of 96 ATAR or equivalent (only EAS adjustment factors considered for this requirement). Indigenous and Gateway students refer to eligibility information.

UAC codes

You will need to gain entry into the corresponding single degree program to accept a Co-op scholarship, e.g. entry into the Bachelor of Actuarial Studies (Co-op) is required for an offer in the Co-op Actuarial Studies Program. Further information and a full list of UAC codes are available online.

Double majors and double degress

Double degrees are increasingly available through Co-op however Co-op scholars must start in a single degree and many single degrees can already accommodate 2 areas of study (e.g. Accounting & Information Systems) as a double major. Double degrees need to be discussed with the Co-op team once you are in the Program. If the double exists, there is a process to apply to gain sponsors' approval.
