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UNSW is proud to be a preferred university for students from low-SES backgrounds. From 2026, we will use the Index of Education and Occupation (IEO) instead of the Index of Relative Socio-Economic Advantage and Disadvantage (IRSAD) to determine UNSW Gateway eligibility, ensuring our support reaches those who need it most.

At UNSW, we are committed to increasing access for students from underrepresented backgrounds, supporting them to succeed at university and preparing them for meaningful careers.

UNSW Gateway has transformed our undergraduate cohort to better reflect the diversity of society and schools in NSW, and enriched the education, culture and overall student experience at UNSW.

We have:

- Widened access: One in four undergraduates at UNSW now come from a Gateway partner school and/or a low-socioeconomic background
- Improved retention: Students who engaged in our program and came to UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway, established an early sense of belonging and have continued their studies at comparable rates to their peers (domestic undergraduates)
- Supported student success: The weighted average marks of these students are on par with their peers in the domestic undergraduate cohort and are consistently achieving academic excellence.

From Year 9 through to university entry, we take an evidence-informed approach that supports students to build academic capability, develop learner confidence and make informed decisions about their futures. Our curriculum-linked learning experiences extend students' interest in their own learning, by connecting their personal values to their future study and careers.

Our alternative entry scheme, the Gateway Admission Pathway is distinct in its design, with every offer conditional on achieving an ATAR, reflecting our belief that academic attainment underpins long-term success at university. Students who enter through the Pathway are also prioritised for scholarships, awards, transition support and employment opportunities.

Key to success are our University Ambassadors who are current UNSW students from equity backgrounds who co-deliver our programs. By sharing their authentic experience, they encourage high school students to imagine new possibilities for their futures, while also strengthening their own employability skills and professional networks.

We are excited to share our 2026 program and to continue to work with you and your students.



Student journey



Our work begins in the pre-access phase of the student journey, where we deliver educational outreach programs designed to build students' learner identity, boost their confidence and strengthen the academic skills needed to excel at school and beyond. As students progress to the access phase, we offer a linked admission pathway that provides equitable access to all undergraduate degrees at UNSW Sydney, alongside supported places in diplomas and preparation programs. We also provide a range of targeted awards and scholarships to enable the effective transition.

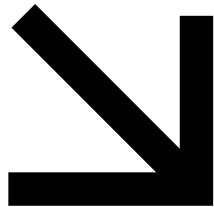

Gateway Admission Pathway ↗

**For eligible
Year 12 students**

An alternative entry pathway to UNSW offering early offers and significantly reduced ATAR requirements for all undergraduate degrees at UNSW Sydney.

Applicants are assessed based on their Year 11 academic results and a written personal statement answering three questions about themselves.

During the Year 11 & 12 Gateway Program, students receive guidance on the pathway and its benefits, and support to craft a strong personal statement.

Gateway Admission Pathway

We know an ATAR isn't the only measure of a student's academic potential or ability to succeed at university.

The Gateway Admission Pathway offers eligible Year 12 students an alternative way into university, with early offers or a significantly reduced ATAR requirement to most undergraduate UNSW degrees.

Who can apply

- To be eligible, students must:**
- Be an Australian resident (or hold a Permanent Humanitarian or Temporary Protection visa)
 - Have completed an Australian Year 12 qualification in the past 5 years

- AND one of the following:**
- Attend a Gateway school
 - Live in a low-socioeconomic area based on IEO index of SEIFA criteria
 - Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
 - Hold a Permanent Humanitarian or Temporary Protection visa.

How it works

Online application:
Students submit an online application including a personal statement responding to three set questions.

Application assessment:
UNSW assesses applications based on the student's Year 11 academic results and personal statement.

Offer rounds:
Two rounds of offers are made with successful applicants receiving either an early offer or an early conditional offer.

Conversion to firm offers:
Students who meet the conditions of their offer receive a firm offer to study at UNSW.

Early offers vs early conditional offers

- Early offer:**
Students must complete the HSC and attain an ATAR regardless of the result.
- Early conditional offer:**
Students must complete the HSC and achieve the adjusted ATAR for their preferred UNSW degree.

ATARs may be reduced by up to 15 points compared to the previous year's lowest selection rank. Adjusted ATARs for 2027 entry will be released in early 2026 and can be found on our website.

Support beyond offers

Students who enter UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway are prioritised for awards and scholarships and receive exclusive access to ongoing academic and transition support.

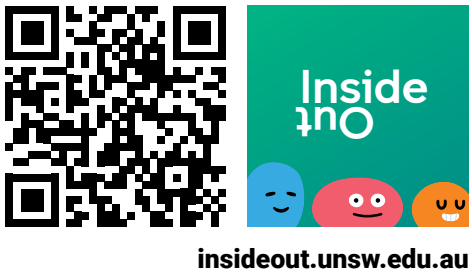

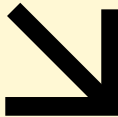

UNSW offers a range of scholarships and awards to students.

- Students entering UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway are automatically considered for **Equity Scholarships** and some students are eligible to receive guaranteed awards if they meet specific criteria.
- **Merit Scholarships** are based on academic performance and require a separate application.

\$10,000 in the first year.

- Reside in a low-socioeconomic area (bottom 25%) based on IEO indexes of SEIFA criteria
- Enrol in Term 1, 2026
- Guaranteed award, no application required.

UNSW Gateway Award

\$1000 one-off payment.

- Attend a Gateway School and apply via the Gateway Admission Pathway
- Enrol in Term 1, 2026
- Guaranteed award, no application required.

UNSW Business Advantage Scholarship

\$10,000 per year for program duration within UNSW Business School.

- Live in a low-socioeconomic area (bottom 25%) based on IEO indexes of SEIFA criteria
- Enrol in Term 1, 2026

- No application required.

Community Plus Scholarship*

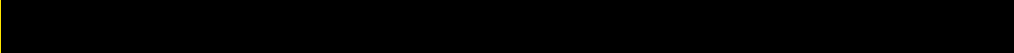

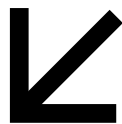
