# Chair's Message

And just like that, another year has flown by with 2024 gone and 2025 now upon us. The GRACE team have had another year of clinical trials, publications, grant success and continued high quality research output. In this year, we have equalled the publications of 2023 – our busiest year to date, with a fantastic output and continued academic growth in gynaecology.

We have celebrated with the promotion of Erin Nesbitt-Hawes to conjoint Associate Professor and our clinician-academic team is amongst the strongest in the field in the country. To underline this, Dr Aaron Budden has submitted his PhD and has 5 publications already in press from his thesis and a 6th likely to be available early in the new year. Outstanding achievements from Erin and Aaron and our congratulations to both of them for their continued work in academic gynaecology.

The NECST network managed by Dr Cecilia Ng has become increasingly strong with the second major pillar of the current grant completed with 12 PhD students and post-doctoral fellows awarded funding for their work in endometriosis. These early and mid-career researchers will be working in 8 institutions

across the country with a range of research topics in endometriosis at the centre of their work. It cannot be overstated how important it is that our young researchers see a career pathway in this underfunded area and their commitment to research and progressing outcomes for all those with endometriosis will pay dividends for years to come.

The GRACE team have submitted a record number of grant applications in 2024 with our work recognised for its quality and importance by substantive funding. We continue with our programs and have met all milestones for funded research. We will continue to lead these initiatives that bring together clinical and scientific research while supporting young researchers in academic pathways. A clear example of this is Dr Fiona Li's studies around the use of thermal energy for the treatment of genito-urinary syndrome of menopause. Fiona's series of works have meant that these devices have not just come under scrutiny by the TGA, but have been withdrawn from the market in a world first. This is truly having an impact on women's health as we highlight not just what does work, but what does not work in scientifically valid studies that continue to have global impact.

There were a host of presentations, travel to international meetings and the team leading clinical, research and hospital agendas. The team continue to do outstanding work and 2025 looks no less busy with the World Congress of Endometriosis a highlight in May with the entire team having major roles in organisation and delivery of this global research meeting. The team have no fewer than 17 presentations and are preparing to bring our work to the world in scientific, clinical and policy work.

With so much happening, it is hard to think what this next year will bring that will top 2024. But I am sure that something will come along to the hard-working GRACE team who are a pleasure to work with and continue to exceed all expectations in every way, each and every day.



# Research @ GRACE

#### **Endometriosis**

• National Endometriosis Clinical and Scientific Trials (NECST) Network

A central priority of the NECST Network's Capacity, Collaboration and Implementation Plan 2023 – 2026 is supporting young and emerging researchers in the area of endometriosis to progress their careers and continue in the field. Aligning with the vision and mission of the NECST Network, the objective of this program is to foster collaborative national research, to



enable and mentor the next generation of new and emerging researchers in endometriosis and/or adenomyosis.

From a total of 26 applicants across Australia, with submissions covering basic science, bioinformatics, qualitative, clinical, data linkage, and mixed methods research categories and review by an international panel – 12 awardees (4 x post-docs and 8 x PhD candidates), across 8 Australian institutes, are to be funded.

The NECST Registry, a key product of Network activities, has continued to grow over 2024 and now has over 2,300 registered participants, maintaining 45-50% retention across all follow-up time-points. Furthermore, over 2024 we added and established the NECST Biorepository, collecting various types of biosamples including frozen tissue, blood, peritoneal fluid and urine. To-date, we have collected over 640 primary types of biosamples from 139 participants.

EndoLinked: Identifying fertility outcomes for women with endometriosis

Our data linkage study exploring assisted reproductive technology (ART) outcomes for women diagnosed with endometriosis, utilising existing State, National and Commonwealth health datasets to develop newer and richer datasets for endometriosis. Initial data analysis, undertaken by the epidemiological and data analyst team (collaborators at the UNSW Centre for Big Data Research and Health, led by Prof Georgina Chambers), have found that i) those with endometriosis as their only recorded cause of infertility had higher ART success rates than those with other causes of infertility; and ii) perinatal and infant outcomes are generally comparable for ART-conceived infants born to mothers with endometriosis alone vs mothers with other causes of infertility. With these results presented and published, at the 2024 Fertility Society of Australia and New Zealand Annual Conference in Perth and Fertility and Sterility, respectively.

 Randomised controlled trial comparing medical and surgical management in adolescents and young adults

This ongoing randomised control trial investigates the effect of laparoscopy on chronic pelvic pain in adolescents and young adults aged 16-25 years. The overarching aim of this RCT is to assess whether there is a reduction in pelvic pain with surgical intervention compared to non-surgical care. In 2019, an observational arm was added to the study to capture patients who declined randomisation. To date there have been 21 (surgical) and 22 (non-surgical) participants enrolled in the randomised arm, with a total of 53 surgical and 55 non-surgical participants enrolled across the entire study.

In 2024, a sub-study was conducted to assess the outcomes of 50 participants at 1-year follow-up. Both groups showed improvement in pain at 12 months, with a greater improvement observed in the surgical group (-24.06%, p<0.01) compared to the non-surgical group (-17.74%, p=0.05). These findings will be presented at WCE in May this year.

#### Uterus transplantation

This trial investigates the feasibility of uterus transplantation in the Australian context for women with uterine factor infertility, and has continued to progress throughout 2024. After the first successful live birth, the recipient has now undergone a hysterectomy to remove the donor uterus, as their family is complete.

To date 3 surgeries have been performed, with 2 pregnancies and 2 live births. In 2025 there will be a greater focus on the deceased donor model, which has now been approved. The team are also working on a new paper, exploring the cultural and religious perceptions of uterus transplantation.

In addition to this, the paper - The first Australian uterus transplantation procedure: A result of a long-term Australian-Swedish research collaboration, published in Australian and New Zealand Journal of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (ANZJOG), is among the top 10 most-cited papers published by the journal in 2023.


