

Check-in Calls



Commonwealth Support Place (CSP) and HECS-FEE Help

A Commonwealth Supported Place is a domestic, subsidised higher education place. This means the government pays a share of your study costs and you pay a share of the costs. Eligible students can use HECS-HELP loan to pay for their student contribution amount.

If you are a student with a Commonwealth Supported Place, you will be required to complete the 'Request for Commonwealth Support and HECS-HELP' form as part of the online acceptance and enrolment process. You must complete the form by the relevant census date for your enrolment.

Concession Opal Card

Full time UNSW students are eligible for a concession Opal Card. This card will give you 50% off all travel in Sydney, including buses, light rail, trains and ferries.

To apply for a concession Opal Card you will need to release your information via MyUNSW, then apply. Your card will be cancelled if you don't complete the required units to be a full-time student.

Student Support Grants

If you are experiencing immediate financial difficulty, UNSW may offer financial support. You can receive a student support grant for things such as essential living, study or medical expenses, technology needed to study, phone or utility bills and bond. Tuition fees are not covered. To be eligible, you must have completed one term of study. To apply, you must first book an appointment with a student support advisor.

Student Loans

UNSW offers a range of loans for students, all of which are repayable and interest-free. To be eligible for a UNSW student loan, you must be: currently enrolled, have completed at least one term of study, have the capacity to repay the loan, be in good academic standing, not have other debts to the university and provide documentary evidence.

Academic Skills Team

Academic Skills are there to assist with report writing, strategic reading to manage workload, wrapping your head around literature reviews, referencing and many other key university skills.

PASS

Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) are weekly study groups led by friendly senior students who have completed the course before. Students who attend PASS do better in their courses, and it's a great way to meet other students. Sessions are offered both in person on campus, and online. Library Peer Mentors

Studiosity

Studiosity is the official place to go to get free personalised feedback on your written work 24/7. Submit any piece of draft writing, including essays, reports and literature reviews, to the UNSW Studiosity platform and get feedback from writing specialists.

You will receive fast feedback on your structure, grammar, choice of language and referencing. You can then use this feedback to strengthen your work before you submit it as a final assignment.
